CSCC St. Catherine Admin Report Feb. 4, 2025

School BUSINESS

1. School Enrolment as of Feb. 4 is 368 (Confirmation of a new portable Sept. 2025)

4. New Gym Request: #3 on the capital project request from RCSD to Sk Learning:

3. St. Catherine Community School – Gym Addition (previous submission- major capital)

This project is to replace the existing gymnasium in St. Catherine Community School. At roughly 202m² (60' x 36' x 14'h) it is the smallest gymnasium in the Division, and below the standard 450m² typically recommended for elementary schools by the Ministry of Education.

St. Catherine Community School has a current enrolment of 367 students that continually increases and a utilization rate of 122%. This school consists of 15 classrooms, plus a resource center and a gym space. The challenge the school is facing is that all rooms are effectively utilized without additional space for band, dance, or choir, and that the gym is not conducive to typical usage of full court type activities and presents significant safety risks due to its lack of space. A new larger gym would provide equal gym size to other local elementary schools and allow repurposing of the existing gym for a multitude of programming options. This project would be a tremendous asset to the school in a neighborhood which has not realized new school infrastructure in decades and would fit perfectly for a lower cost capital project.

This project would include construction of a new gymnasium and related spaces, adequate gym floor space to meet Ministry of Education standards for safe play and physical education curriculum; additional washrooms to satisfy codes of the growing school population; as well as renovation to the existing gymnasium to provide multipurpose group assembly space for curriculum such as band or choir and smaller breakout spaces for student assistance and development, neither of which are currently available in the current footprint.


