Old Business: Elishia

- **Walk-a-thon planning**
 - Friday, May 30, 2025
 - Morning prizes announcement then walk-a-thon then CSCC providing lunch
 - Discussed having max 15 tickets per child but have those that sold more be able to put their name in larger prize packs.
 - Discussed that the top 15 sellers get a ride on the party bus (Bombe Rides) and to an activity centre like Activate or Aspen links, etc.
 - \$800 in prizes
 - Discussed Challenging each grade to do the following laps:
 - Grades k-2 walk one lap
 - Grades 3-4 walk two laps
 - Grades 5-6 walk three laps
 - Grades 7-8 walk 4 laps.
 - CSCC Feeds the kids as they arrive back to school. Discussed doing that in their classrooms or outside.
 - Food – either build your own sandwich or hot dogs. Also have cut up cucumbers and carrots with dip.
 - Hot Dogs – 20 packs - \$400, Buns 30 dozen (6/dozen), build your own sandwich will be more money but will discuss further.
 - BUDGET: \$1,000
 - GOAL is to raise 15,000 this year.
 - LAUNCH DATE: April 28 and open until May 23.
- **Playground**
 - Elishia met with a rep from Playgrounds Are Us at the school and showed the outdoor space to improve. The rep will put together options and provide to Elishia.
 - Discussed more swings, then options for older students and benches out front of school on the new green space once complete.
